

2007 Sharing Sydney Harbour Access Program Grants

\$200,000 to City of Canada Bay for the Bay Run, Drummoyne – pavement width and extension.

The project involves widening the Iron Cove Bay Run on the eastern side of Henley Marine Drive between Henley and Thompson Streets, Drummoyne to achieve a consistent paving width along the section of the circuit within the City of Canada Bay local government area.

\$45,000 to Hunters Hill Council for the Parramatta River Foreshore Access and Protection Part 4 project.

The works include Kelly's Bush Reserve upgrade of foreshore track and bushland regeneration. The works at Gladesville Reserve include the construction of a boardwalk, drainage improvements and associated bush regeneration.

\$81,500 to Leichhardt Council for pedestrian and cycle access improvements at Hawthorne Canal.

The construction of a pedestrian/cycle bridge over Hawthorne Canal which will link Blackmore Oval with Hawthorne Canal Reserve. The project will increase recreation links between the two local government areas and to the Iron Cove Bay Run.

\$54,925 to Leichhardt Council for Access and Embellishment between Mort Bay and Ballast Point Park.

The project involves the landscaping and treatment of the end of Yeend Street, Balmain to provide a green space and pedestrian and cycle link between Mort Bay Park and the regional parkland at Ballast Point.

\$80,500 to Leichhardt Council for a timber boardwalk linking Ternan Street to Broadside Street, Balmain.

The project involves the construction of a 70 metre timber boardwalk at Cameron's Cove, Balmain. The boardwalk will allow a connection from Darling Street to the foreshore at Cameron's Cove and will also include a viewing platform and interpretive signage.

\$50,000 to Manly Council for the East – West Cycleway Link, Balgowlah to Manly.

The project involves the widening of the existing footpath on the southern side of Lauderdale Avenue and White Street providing a safe and efficient east-west link for pedestrians and cyclists.

\$26,625 to Mosman Council to the Spit Reserve Foreshore Access Project.

The project involves the construction of a 250 metre shared pathway for pedestrian and cyclists on the western side of the Spit Reserve. Works also include landscaping and installation of furniture.

\$80,500 to Mosman Council for the Rehabilitation of Clifton Gardens Jetty.

The project will upgrade the existing jetty structure at Clifton Gardens. This will improve the structural integrity of the jetty and provide safe access for the public using the facility for recreational boat and fishing purposes.

\$12,500 to Mosman Council for Access Improvements at Clifton Gardens.

The construction and installation of two timber access ramps providing formalised access points from Clifton Gardens Reserve to the Harbour Beach.

\$19,650 to Mosman Council to provide foreshore access through Parriwi Lighthouse

Establishing formalised access through the Parriwi Lighthouse Reserve to the Middle Harbour foreshore, providing a missing link within the regional walking trail and establishing an access route for pedestrians during low tide.

\$7,900 to Mosman Council for bushland track upgrades at Pearl Bay.

Improve the quality of the bushland walking track along Pearl Bay so to complete a continuous 2 kilometre walk along the Middle Harbour foreshore. Works involve the upgrade and installation of sandstone steps, signage and bush regeneration.

\$16,000 to Mosman Council to improve small boat access at Mosman Bay, Pearl Bay and Little Sirius Cove.

The upgrade and installation of new access infrastructure for small boats at three locations in the Mosman Council area.

\$28,600 to National Parks and Wildlife Service NSW for a new crossing at Gordon's Creek, Garigal National Park.

The establishment of 300 metres of walking track and a stepping stone crossing at Gordon's Creek within Garigal National Park. This will retain an important link in the network of Middle Harbour walking tracks.

\$113,000 to National Parks and Wildlife Service NSW for track upgrades and viewing platform along the Manly Scenic Walkway.

The upgrade of 1 kilometre of the Manly Scenic Walkway from Tania Park to the Grotto Point track junction at Dobroyd Head. Works include the installation of timber boardwalk, upgrading the track surface, drainage, the reinstatement of sandstone steps and the installation of a viewing platform and signage.

\$57,000 to Parramatta City Council for Stage 2 Boardwalk Access along Toongabbie Creek.

The construction of a 60 metre shared timber boardwalk along Toongabbie Creek. The proposed works are part of an overall project which aims to improve connections between Parramatta CBD and Parramatta River to the surrounding suburbs.

\$20,000 to City of Canada Bay and Strathfield Councils for the Hamilton Street Bridge across Powell's Creek.

The design and construction of a pedestrian/cycle bridge across Powell's Creek. The bridge will provide crucial access in the Powell's Creek Corridor 'Harbour to Hinterland' project, providing a link between Strathfield Town Centre and Homebush Bay Parklands and the Parramatta River foreshore.

\$18,800 to City of Sydney Council for Water Access Steps at Rushcutters Bay Park.

The construction of water access steps at Rushcutters Bay Park. The project will facilitate public access, including non-motorised light water craft to the harbour foreshore within the existing sea wall.

\$18,055 to City of Sydney Council for Water Access Steps at Elizabeth Bay.

The project involves the construction of water access steps in Kings Cross Rotary Park, Elizabeth Bay. The project will facilitate public access, including non-motorised light water craft, to the harbour foreshore within the existing sea wall.

\$162,000 to City of Sydney Council for cycleway routes along Orphans School Creek and Bicentennial Park.

The project will formalise over 700 metres of shared access paths from the Orphan School Creek corridor at Forest Lodge to the Glebe Foreshore at Bicentennial Park, Rozelle Bay.

\$137,813 to City of Ryde Council for Shepherds Bay Park Wharf.

The project involves the construction of a jetty and pontoon at the proposed new parkland at Shepherds Bay, Meadowbank. The project will provide facilities for smaller recreational boats and a launching point for canoes and kayaks.

\$115,000 to Willoughby City Council for the establishment of two new bushland walking tracks along Middle Harbour foreshore.

The establishment of over 1.5 kilometres of new walking tracks along the Middle Harbour foreshore, providing additional access around Sailors Bay and H.D. Robb Reserve at Castle Cove.

\$3,606 to Woollahra Council for dinghy storage at Gibson Beach Reserve, Watsons Bay.

The installation of a dinghy storage facility at Gibson Beach Reserve Watsons Bay, catering for a total of 15 dinghies.

\$5,435 to Woollahra Council for dinghy storage at Tingira Memorial Park, Rose Bay

The installation of a dinghy storage facility at Tingira Memorial Reserve, Rose Bay, catering for a total of 22 dinghies.

\$39,000 to Woollahra Council for an Aboriginal and Cultural Heritage Interpretative Project at Cliff Street, Camp Cove.

The project involves relaying a section of Cliff Street, Watson's Bay using original and salvaged sandstone cobbles, installation of interpretative signage and lettering creating a descriptive story of both Aboriginal and cultural heritage of the site.
