BCA 2006 INFORMATION SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS

Featuring the new BCA provisions including Energy Efficiency

Changes to the Building Code of Australia (BCA) for 2006, including important new energy efficiency provisions, are close to finalisation. As building industry practitioners and certifiers you need to know what changes are coming into effect. The Australian Building Codes Board (ABCBC), in conjunction with its seminar partner, is hosting a series of Information Seminars in capital cities around Australia to inform you of these changes to the BCA.

The one-day seminars will be divided into morning sessions and afternoon workshops. The morning sessions will be hosted by the ABCBC and will provide an overview of the changes to the BCA, including those for energy efficiency. The afternoon workshops will be hosted by Australian Institute of Building Surveyors (AIBS) and will interest mainly building surveyors and certifiers. The workshop will provide training on the practical application of the new energy efficiency provisions including building fabric, glazing, maintenance, lighting, compliance, assessment and an overview of State and Territory administrative processes.

New enhanced energy efficiency provisions for housing will apply in the Australian Capital Territory, South Australia, Western Australia and Victoria in 2006. The new provisions for Classes 5 to 9 buildings will apply in all States and Territories except the Northern Territory in 2006. Non energy changes to the BCA will apply in all jurisdictions.

The energy efficiency provisions for Class 5 - 9 buildings will affect:

- Building envelope insulation
- Glazing
- Building sealing
- Air movement
- Air-conditioning and Ventilating
- Lighting
- Hot water supply services
- Maintenance
- Verification methods

The objective of the seminars is to inform you of the coming changes and present you with the facts and know-how to successfully apply the BCA.

If you are involved in building or approving buildings you need to know how these provisions will affect the way you work. The seminars will provide you with an opportunity to learn the issues from technical experts. From an introductory overview through to specific issues, you will be able to identify key areas for action.
