The NSW Government is investigating opportunities to enhance Macquarie Park as an important commercial centre.

Planning for the future

The Department of Planning and Environment and City of Ryde Council are working together to investigate opportunities to enhance Macquarie Park's role as a major commercial centre. This will include looking at opportunities for more jobs, homes, shops, restaurants, cycleways and open space within walking distance to local train stations.

A key aim of the investigation is to retain a commercial core to support long-term employment growth. Connecting people with new services, infrastructure and open spaces will also be important to ensure Macquarie Park remains a great place to live and work.

The investigation will be carried out by the Department of Planning and Environment and City of Ryde Council, and will be supported by specialist studies.


Community and stakeholder input will play an important part in shaping the future of Macquarie Park, and there will be a range of opportunities to take part.

What studies will inform the investigations?

A number of detailed technical studies will inform the investigation including studies into employment, urban design, traffic and transport, and open space and community facilities.

The studies will also include an assessment of the infrastructure needed by communities into the future.

The types of future development in the precinct will be considered as part of the investigation and through consultation with the local community, businesses and landowners.



Where is the investigation area?

The Macquarie Park investigation area includes land within walking distance of Macquarie Park, Macquarie University and North Ryde train stations. The investigation area is located on either side of the North Ryde Station Precinct and is adjacent to the eastern boundary of the Macquarie University (Herring Road) Precinct.

How can you get involved?

There are a number of ways you can get involved and share your ideas. There will be online surveys, community briefing sessions and email updates throughout the investigation process.

The Department will be holding the first community information session on Wednesday 16th March 2016 to provide more information about the investigation process and how to get involved.
