- Under the EP&A Regulation council must give consideration to this Part before adopting a DCP

- The purpose of this part is to provide a toolbox for councils when developing their building envelopes and primary planning controls
- It explains how to set and test the primary controls
- It could also be used by councils during their strategic planning

- It is to be used when designing or assessing a residential apartment development

3C	Public domain interface
3D	Communal and public open space
3E	Deep soil zone
3F	Visual privacy *
3G	Pedestrian access and entries
3H	Vehicle access
3J	Bicycle and car parking

^{*} Visual privacy is covered by clause 6A of the SEPP (the same matters in a DCP have no effect)

- Part 4 addresses the design of apartment buildings in more detail, focusing on the internal function and design
- Part 4 is to be used when designing or assessing a residential apartment development proposal
- The sections include objectives, design criteria (not all sections) and design guidance
