


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1. BACKGROUND



Cadia is one of Australia's largest gold mining operations and is 100 per cent owned by Newcrest Mining Ltd. It is located approximately 25 kilometers from the city of Orange in Central West New South Wales.

Cadia comprises two mines - the Cadia East underground panel cave mine which commenced commercial production on 1 January 2013 and the Ridgeway underground mine (currently on care and maintenance). The previously mined Cadia Hill open pit, is currently approved for the deposition of tailings.



At Cadia, Newcrest produces gold doré from a gravity circuit and goldrich copper concentrates from a flotation circuit. Gold doré from Cadia

is refined at the Perth Mint and concentrates are piped to a dewatering plant at nearby Blayney and sent by rail to Port Kembla in New South Wales for export mainly to Eastern Asia.

2. COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED

The Department of Planning and Environment (The Department) is committed to community engagement in the NSW planning system. It recognises that people should have a say in matters that affect their lives, and that community engagement results in better planning outcomes. State significant projects are large, complex and can have major economic, social and environmental impacts over a long time. The Department encourages proponents to consult widely with the community and stakeholder groups at all stages of the project.

The purpose of a community consultative committee (CCC) is to provide a forum for discussion between the proponent and representatives of the community, stakeholder groups and the local councils on issues directly relating to a specific state significant project.

As a condition of the Cadia East Project development consent Newcrest established and operates a Community Consultative Committee (CCC). The CCC is an advisory committee which is required to operate in general accordance with the Community Consultative Committee Guidelines for State Significant Projects (Department of Planning and Environment, November 2016)¹.

In accordance with the guideline, the Committee comprises of an independent chair and appropriate representation from the community, stakeholder groups and the local councils.

5. LOCATION OF MEETINGS

10. COMMUNICATION WITH THE COMMUNITY

The committee discuss operational information and are encouraged to share information with their local communities and stakeholders. Committee members, as representatives of their respective communities should bring any questions or concerns from their constituents to be addressed by Newcrest.

Cadia publish a quarterly newsletter which is distributed to residents whom reside near the mining operations and is published to the company website for access by the public. Residents meetings are also held six-monthly to provide operational updates and open forums for questions, answers and discussions between representatives of Cadia' senior leadership team and the community. Cadia also holds specific community consultation meetings retarding upcoming modifications and approvals.

Cadia hosts an Open Day approximately every two-years of which the next will be held in 2019, historically more than 2000 people attend each event and we expect similar attendance at our next open day.
