## 1. Executive Summary

The Sancrox Quarry is a hard rock quarry located in Sancrox approximately 8 kilometres west of Port Macquarie, within the Port Macquarie Hastings Council (PMHC) local government area on the Mid North Coast of NSW, 380km north of Sydney. The development operates under consents issued by Council since 1995, however, the company, Hanson, recently applied to extend the life of the quarry by expanding the approved extraction boundary to facilitate the extraction and distribution of construction materials for the use in civil infrastructure, concrete, road construction projects.

Accordingly, a CCC was established in 2018 as part of the consultation process for this application and the SEARs issued by the Secretary. The CCC operates in accordance with the guidelines and consists of the following:

- Six local community representatives
- One LGA delegate
- One stakeholder group delegate (Residents Action Network)
- Three company representatives (Hanson); and
- One Independent Chairperson.

To date only one meeting has been held – 6 July 2018. The company is currently preparing the Environmental Impact Statement for submission to the Department, following which the next CCC meeting will be scheduled.

The CCC will be an effective communication forum between the community and the company, during the assessment of the state significant development application.

#### 2. CCC activities over last 12 months

- The committee met in May, 2018 and received a comprehensive presentation from the proponent on the preparation of the Environmental Impact Statement for its plans to extend the life of the quarry. This included, but not limited to:
  - Project Overview
  - Operating Hours
  - Employment generation
  - Available Resource
  - Preparation of reports (Noise, Air Quality, Transport/Traffic, Surface Water and Groundwater, Biodiversity, Social and Economic)
  - Future monitoring programs
  - Consultation process
  - Current and future quarry layout
  - Surrounding land zonings

- Rehabilitation and final land use and
- Voluntary Planning Agreements.

# 3. Key issues

As the CCC is in its infancy and early stages of the assessment process, trending topics for the committee are focussed on the proposed expansion.
