Community Consultative Committee Details

1. Executive Summary

It was an active year for the CCC with four standard CCC meetings taking place.

Key issues that were considered and discussed throughout the year were the possible N5 extended area works, the potential for site and catchment visits, and resolution of some long-standing actions.
