### 1. Executive Summary

The EnergyAustralia Lithgow Regional Community Consultative Committee (CCC) was established in 2018 and combined previous committees overseeing the operational Mt Piper and the decommissioned Wallerawang power stations, and the Pine Dale Mine.

Mt Piper station is envisaged to remain operating until 2040. Pine Dale Mine is in care and maintenance mode and is currently not operating. The Wallerawang power station is no longer within EnergyAustralia's portfolio and therefore is not covered by the CCC.

The CCC operates in accordance with the Department of Planning and Environment's Revised 2023 Community Consultative Committee Guidelines for State Significant Projects. In the December 2023 meeting the committee discussed and agreed to terms of reference under the revised guidelines.

The committee currently meets four times per year. Community representatives' attendance has been solid with a quorum for all meetings. Throughout the year the committee has had opportunities to be informed of, and provide feedback on, matters relating to:

- planning for:
- Mt Piper Battery
- Lake Lyell Pumped Hydro
- · Planning applications related to water management and changes to ash repository operations
- water management
- groundwater monitoring and leachate within the vicinity of ash repositories
- site operations
- environmental performance
- feral pest management
- status of mining leases
- rehabilitation activities
- the energy market and the transition to renewables
- community programs.

- Mt Piper Battery Energy Storage System
- the energy transition
- water management
- groundwater quality
- water quality in rivers, creeks, and dams
- feral pest control
- the Federal Opposition's announcement of possible nuclear power generation at Mt Piper.

In addition to CCC meetings, members also have:

- direct channels of communication with the EnergyAustralia Community Engagement team on site matters
- been forwarded copies of relevant media releases, notifications, and newsletters as they became available.

# 3. Key issues

There are many aspects to EnergyAustralia's operations within the Lithgow region. These are detailed in individual meeting minutes, and the following table provides an overview of key issues of interest to the CCC:

- The Lake Lyell Pumped Hydro proposal and the forthcoming exhibition of the EIS as part of the CSSI application.
- ongoing environmental performance.
- Mt Piper operations.
- ash repository management.
- surface and groundwater water quality.
- community funding programs.

As per the guidelines group members can nominate agenda items for meetings and the proponent is quite responsive to these requests. It is noted that some of the questions being asked by committee members about the Lake Lyell proposal are subject to ongoing investigation and studies.
