1.0 Introduction

This annual report provides a record of the 2024 activities of the combined Community Consultative Committee for the Peppertree Quarry (PTQ) and Marulan South Limestone Mine (MSL), operated by Boral, at Marulan South. The Community Consultative Committee was formed and operates in accordance with:

- Condition A16 of the consent for the Peppertree Quarry (MP06_0074); and,
- Condition A24 of the consent for the Marulan South Limestone Mine Continued Operations Project (SSD 7009).

The respective conditions are in **Appendix A** to this report

Condition A25 of the MSL consent provides for the following:

A25. With the approval of the Planning Secretary, the Applicant may combine the CCC required by this consent with any similar CCC required by a consent or approval for any adjoining mine or quarry subject to common, shared or related ownership or management.

At the commencement of 2023, in accordance with Condition A25, the CCC required by the MSL consent was combined with PTQ CCC which adjoins the MSL operations and in common ownership of Boral. The PTQ CCC has been in existence since 2008. The combined CCC was formed following an Expression of Interest process through the local media and community newsletters process seeking nominations for local community representatives.

2.0 Peppertree Quarry and Marulan South Limestone Mine CCC

The Combined Peppertree Quarry and Marulan South Limestone Mine Community Consultative Committee was established and first met on 15 February 2023. The combined CCC includes members who have been part of the Peppertree Quarry CCC since 2008.






Air – Dust deposition Gauge D1



Peppertree Quarry Deposited Dust 2017 - 2024 Onsite (NW boundary)







Peppertree Quarry PM10 annual average trend 2014 - 2024





Peppertree Quarry PM10 24 hour performance 2019-2024







Surface water - Turbidity



Surface water – Total dissolved solids



Surface water – total Phosphorus





Peppertree Quarry PM10 annual average trend 2014 - 2024





Peppertree Quarry PM10 24 hour performance 2019-2024











































Appendix C – Community Updates

SOUTHERN SUPER HAULAGE

In 1966, Marulan resident Mr Bob Shepherd, sold his truck business to Mr & Mrs Stan Robinson of Mt Ousley, North Wollongong. At that time Stan owned the trucks that carried the agitators for Specified Concrete. He then had to buy trucks with tippers to cart superphosphate. He called his new venture Southern Super Haulage (SSH) and the depot was based in the main street of Marulan (at that time the Hume Highway) on the site of the present Truckstop 31. The depot consisted of a house and garage, an igloo shaped shed and a petrol bowser. In the late 1960s, a weighbridge and a much larger shed workshop was erected which is still there.

The Government of the day was subsidising the price of super, consequently, business was booming as property owners took

advantage of the monetary savings. The super was imported from the Island of Nauru and was stored at Port Kembla. The trucks came from everywhere and the queues at the terminal were miles long as the drivers patiently waited to be loaded. Two of the Marulan based truck drivers would leave at 1.30am, driving to Port Kembla down Macquarie Pass to get to the terminal queue early. Eventually, almost thirty trucks were working for

SSH, with the loads going to many destinations, some being Braidwood, Araluen, Yass, Gunning, Taralga, Crookwell, Burrawang, Kangaroo Valley, Goulburn and all places in between! Local agents organised the loads. Mr Doug Southwell at Gunning and Mr Charles Bradbury at Taralga were involved. On the land behind the Truckstop building trees and scrub were cleared and the super was stockpiled. Later, the large corrugated shed in the corner was built to house the super. Huge yellow plastic tarpaulins covered the stockpiles and they were held down with old tyres. There were no mobile phones during this era and many times the drivers had to walk miles for help for mishaps such break downs or were bogged, etc. They all reported that the land owners were always so pleased to see them when they arrived with the super, and only too happy to stand and have a chat or a "cuppa".

A fair bit of the spreading was done by air where the land was particularly steep or heavily timbered. Stan's business lasted eleven years and some of the drivers were Billy Rowley, Billy Smith, Dick Robertson, Robert Wood-Davies, Bill Pender, Nat Waters, Ross and Fred Missingham, Harold Scott, Brian Parsons, Messrs Rudd and Madden (names unknown – can anyone help?) Johnnie McKellar, Jimmy Wilkins, Paul Humphries, Mick Cabot and Malcolm Hair. Mr Bruce Hale, one of the principals of Marulan Truck and Bus, remembers coming to work on the SSH trucks. He was then a young mechanic based in Lansvale. Dawn Transport from Moss Vale also delivered super locally. Local lad, Jimmy Woodward was employed full time as a mechanic. When the Government subsidy was abolished on super, the cartage reduced considerably. The SSH trucks were then used to cart lime, gravel, road base, coal and grain, The use of dog tailers enabled them to cart heavier loads. Loads of lime were also taken to the CSR works at Port Botany, Sydney and Fifield in Central NSW. The business was sold to Western Gold and they sold to Heggies. The late Mr Malcolm Biddlecome later bought the site and Truckstop 31 was born.

Footnote – Many older residents will remember that Bob Shepherd's wife was Kath Shepherd, a very popular and long time teacher at Marulan Public School.

Sydney Metro West Project

A big shout out to our teams currently operating the 3x precast plants 24hours a day 6 days a week supplying concrete for the Sydney Metro West Project, a twin 24km underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD.

The facility located at Eastern Creek is impressive to say the least, with tunnel industry experts touting it as a world first (3 Plants supplying 1 tunnel) and unlikely to be seen again.

A total of 228,723m³ of concrete will be supplied to produce 151,230 concrete segments used to line the tunnels.

Big tyres making a big difference

Tyres used in our quarry operations are joining the circular economy, with their rubber being used in local roads as part of a trial by Queensland's Sunshine Coast Council. Known as off-the-road (OTR) tyres, this type of tyre is generally from large-scale vehicles such as dump trucks and loaders used on mining and construction sites with no roads.

Together with the Sunshine Coast Council, the Australian Flexible Pavement Association and Tyre Stewardship Australia we trailed the use of rubber binder from OTR tyres and asphalt to test for optimum performance in different traffic conditions. Boral bought steel reserves from the nearby British Naval Store yards, that had been stockpiled during the war (for military ships and submarines) and re-rolled them to use as storage tanks.

Boral Supporting Community Events

Boral was proud to support the Tallong Apple Day and the Goulburn Mulwaree Council Community bike ride which focuses on road safety. Both were fantastic days, and we look forward to assisting with these events again in 2025

The Way Forward for Peppertree Quarry

Looking ahead, we are beginning to investigate the long-term future of Peppertree's hard rock resources, particularly the significant granodiorite resource on Boral's landholdings north, between Tangarang and Marulan Creek. We are early stages of planning and will provide more detail as investigations progress.

Due to forecasted demand in housing and infrastructure in Sydney and regional markets we are proposing a modification to Peppertree's approval to increase the production and transport limit for rail dispatch from 3.5 to 5 million tonnes per annum.

This will be achieved within existing operating hours and efficiencies gained through plant and maintenance optimisation over recent years. Road transport limits are not proposed to change on what is already approved.
