1. Executive Summary

Metropolitan Coal Mine is one of the oldest continually operating coal mines in Australia and has been part of the Helensburgh community for 130 years. With its location amongst residential areas and the national park in Helensburgh, Metropolitan continues to meet its environmental monitoring requirements and community expectations in a sensitive region.

The committee members continue to receive informative presentations from staff on the mine's operations and compliance with conditions of approval, including:

- Findings of Independent Environmental Audits and Annual Reviews.
- Updates on Extraction Plan & Long Wall modifications.
- Noise monitoring and mitigation improvements.
- Air quality results.
- Groundwater monitoring results.
- Updates to the Water Management Plan (WMP).
- Pillar Extraction areas.
- Complaints register; and
- Its community investment program in the region.

The Community Consultative Committee (CCC) operates in accordance with the Department of Planning & Environment's Community Consultative Committee Guidelines for State Significant Development (June 2023). The committee membership consists of:

- Five local community representatives
- Two stakeholder group representatives (National Parks Association & one person representing Helensburgh Lions Club and Helensburgh Probus Club)
- One Wollongong City Council delegate
- Three company representatives; and
- One Independent Chairperson.

I am pleased to report that Peabody Energy continue to consult with the community at a high level with three meetings held over each calendar year, being April, July and November with quite good attendance by members.

The CCC is an effective communication forum between the community, the Council and the company. It functions well and accordingly, fulfils its objectives under the Department's guidelines.

2. CCC activities over last 12 months

- There were meetings held in April 2024 (with previous Chair), July 2024, and November 2024 on site.
- Members received comprehensive presentations on items such as:
 - The mine's environmental monitoring activities
 - Company and Mine Update

- Project Modifications
- Exploration Leases
- EPA investigations

- Surface & Groundwater
- Water treatment plant
- Turkeys Nest Upgrade Works
- LW Extraction Plan
- The CCC also receives a summary of the project's Annual Review results.
- The members of the CCC have developed Terms of Reference for this committee as well
 as completed the necessary governance forms (Pecuniary Interest Declarations and Code
 of Conduct), which will be reviewed annually.
- There were no joint CCC's held.
