

Creating a BASIX Certificate for Multi Dwellings

This guide outlines how to use the NSW Planning Portal BASIX tool to create a BASIX certificate for a multi-dwelling development such as residential flat buildings, villas and dual occupancy dwellings. Review the information on our website to find out if your development is categorised as multi-dwelling.

Throughout the tool you will be requested to provide information about the development to estimate the water and energy consumption and the thermal performance, ensuring your development meets the BASIX requirements.

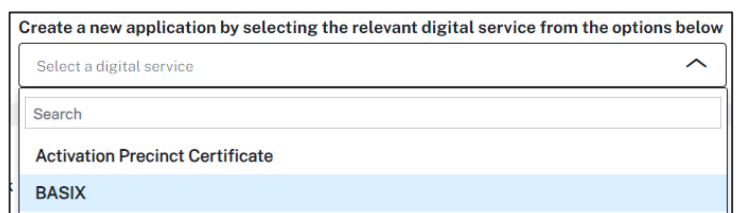
Once you have successfully completed the assessment and meet the BASIX targets, you can generate a BASIX certificate to be submitted with your development application or complying development certificate.

Getting started

1. Log in to the [NSW Planning Portal](#) and **select** BASIX from the Create a new application dropdown menu.

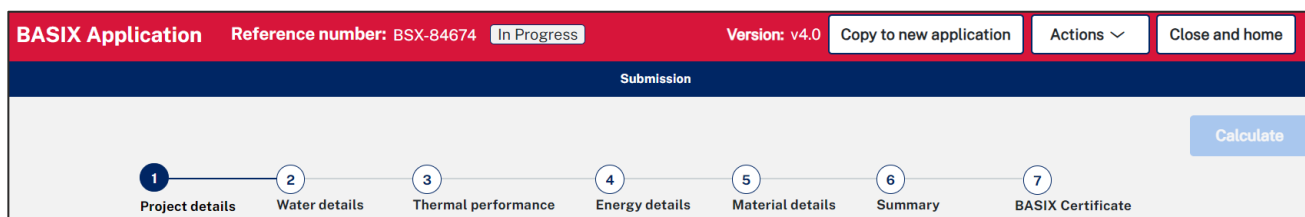

Note: The BASIX application will be initiated and a unique reference number to your BASIX application commencing with BSX. There are several sections to the application, starting with project details.



Navigating the application

Note: The below items will assist with navigating the application and can apply to most sections of the application.

1. Throughout the online form, mandatory fields are indicated with an asterisk (*), and predictive functionality is indicated by a blue triangle on the bottom right-hand corner of the field box.
2. In line help is available throughout the application process in the form of tool tips. There are 2 different tools tips available on the application;
 - **Hover** over information icons  to view help text in line with the application.
 - **Click** [What is this?](#) to view detailed help text.
3. **Read** the notes and callouts provided throughout the application for guidance on how to complete the application.

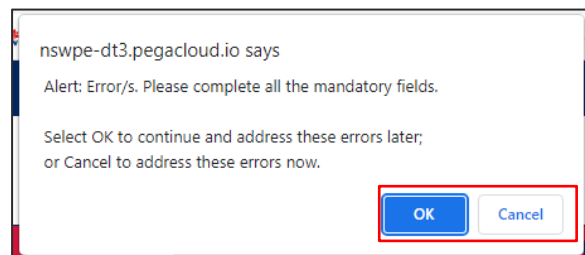

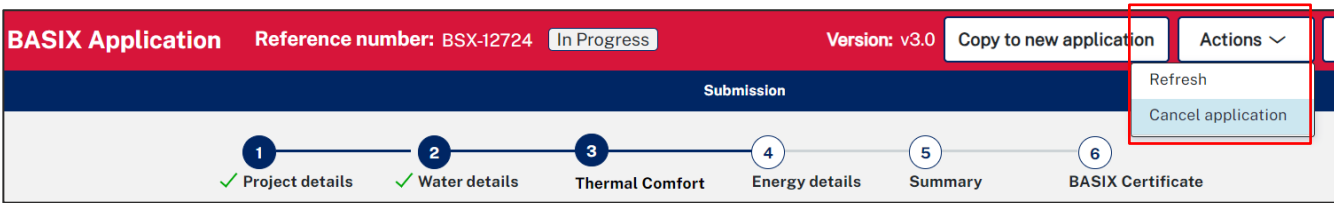

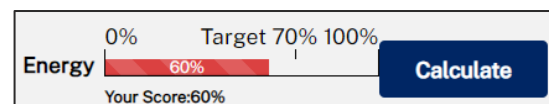

BASIX Certificate

Note: This is the final section of the application, where we can generate our BASIX certificate once we have passed the assessment, confirmed on the summary section.

You can complete the following actions at the BASIX Certificate section.

Fee waiver for bushfire affected homes

Note: If your project is related to rebuilding dwellings damaged or destroyed by the 2019-2020 bushfires, you can apply for a BASIX certificate fee waiver.

- Select** Apply fee waiver to open and **complete** the application form before submitting.

Apply fee waiver

Note: Your application will be sent to the Department of Planning and Environment for consideration. If your request for fee waiver is approved, you will be notified and may generate and download your BASIX certificate.

Alternative assessments

Note: If your design cannot be assessed by the BASIX assessment tool you may be eligible to apply for an alternate assessment. Review the information provided on this process [here](#).

- To apply for an alternative assessment **select** apply and **complete** the form before submitting.

Note: Your application will be sent to the Department of Planning and Environment for consideration, and you will be notified of the decision. If your request is approved, you can make fee payment and download your BASIX certificate.

BASIX certificate

Note: Once your BASIX Certificate is created, your application will be complete.

- To proceed to create a BASIX Certificate, **select** Request Certificate.

Note: You will be directed to where you can confirm payer details that will be included on the tax invoice generated.

- Click** proceed to pay to continue.

- Click** pay now to make your fee payment.

Pay now

Note: You will be taken to the Service NSW payment gateway to make your fee payment. Once paid, your application will be completed, and the BASIX certificate generated.

4. Following payment, you will be redirected to the application.
